


STUDENT DEMOGRAPHICS





DISTRICTS OF RESIDENCE



ACADEMIC PROGRESS

The goals of South Columbus Preparatory Academy by 2023 were for:

- 80% of K-2 students to achieve one year of growth in Reading on the i-Ready growth assessment
- 70% of Grade 3-8 students to score proficient in Reading on the Ohio state assessment (or show one year of growth)
- 75% of K-8 students to achieve one year of growth in Math on the i-Ready growth assessment
- 60% of Grade 3-8 students to score proficient in Math on the Ohio state assessment (or show one year of growth)


SCPA exceeded its academic goals with 86% of students achieving one year of growth in Reading and 88% of students achieving one year of growth in Math. Additionally, the school increased its Performance Index (PI) score year-over-year and earned 3 or more stars in most report card components.

St. Aloysius, as the sponsor of this school, is legally mandated to provide oversight, monitoring, and technical assistance.
